Primary 3 Territory-wide System Assessment in 2018

(Note: This circular memorandum should be read by heads of all primary schools, excluding ESF and international schools, for necessary action.)

Purpose

Date: 19 March 2018

The purpose of this circular memorandum is to inform schools of the arrangements for the Primary 3 Territory-wide System Assessment (TSA) in 2018.

Background

- On 16 March 2018, the Coordinating Committee on Basic Competency Assessment and Assessment Literacy (the Committee) submitted to the Education Bureau (EDB) recommendations following the comprehensive review of TSA. Related report has been uploaded to the EDB website¹.
- 3. The Committee points out that from the perspective of the education profession, at the territory-wide level, TSA is an objective tool to provide the Government with territory-wide information for reviewing the effectiveness of education policies and the arrangements for curriculum planning; and at the school level, TSA is a realisation of the concept of "assessment for learning". TSA school reports provide reliable and valid information to help schools understand the overall performance of students and enable teachers to provide feedback and take follow-up actions in a focused and timely manner for the purpose of enhancing the effectiveness of learning and teaching.

Primary 3 TSA

Four Enhancement Measures

- 4. In the report, the Committee affirms the function and importance of TSA in providing feedback to learning and teaching at both the territory-wide and school levels, comments favourably on the effectiveness of the four major enhancement measures, and reaffirms the intent and positioning of TSA as "a low-stake assessment with emphasis on feedback". The four enhancement measures include:
 - improving assessment papers and question design;
 - enhancing school reports;
 - strengthening professional support measures; and
 - including a questionnaire survey on students' learning attitude and motivation.

The Committee recommends that **the four major enhancement measures be implemented on a regular basis**. The EDB has accepted the Committee's recommendations.

Administrative Arrangements

If considered only from the perspective of the education profession, the Committee regards that the enhancement measures have effectively alleviated public's concerns about drilling and risks induced by TSA. However, the Committee also takes into account the community's understanding of TSA, the different pace among schools' development in the use of assessment information to improve learning and teaching, and perceptions of some members of the community on the existing Therefore, the Committee recommends that the feedback at the arrangements. territory-wide level and the school level be handled separately. The EDB has accepted the Committee's recommendations. At the territory-wide level, the Primary 3 TSA will be conducted every year on a sampling basis, with about 10% of students sampled from each public sector and Direct Subsidy Scheme school. In addition, to understand the overall learning performance of non-Chinese speaking students and students with special educational needs and provide appropriate support, a certain number of students from these two student groups have to be separately sampled to meet the statistical requirements. Students' performance will only be counted as territory-wide data. Since only a small number of students in each school will participate in the assessment, school reports will not be provided.

6. At the school level, the education sector generally agrees with the concept of assessment for learning in the review. A considerable number of schools would like their Primary 3 students to participate in TSA and obtain detailed school reports so that they can draw reference from the analysis to improve learning and teaching in a focused manner. The Hong Kong Examinations and Assessment Authority (HKEAA) will cater for the needs of these schools and make arrangements to enable all Primary 3 students to participate in the assessment and to provide school reports. Schools with such plans may approach the HKEAA directly. The HKEAA will make relevant arrangements and issue school reports to schools directly. The EDB will not obtain school reports of individual schools from the HKEAA.

Assessment Dates

- 7. The audio-visual assessment for Chinese Language and the speaking assessments for Chinese Language and English Language at Primary 3 level will be conducted on a sampling basis on **2 or 3 May 2018** (with 8 May as the fallback date). The HKEAA will inform schools nearer the time on which of these two days the speaking assessments will be conducted.
- 8. The written assessments for Chinese Language, English Language and Mathematics at Primary 3 level will be conducted on a sampling basis on **12 and 13 June 2018** (with 15 June as the fallback date) (the HKEAA will provide each school with a list of participating students on the assessment day). The written assessments at Primary 3 and Primary 6 levels will be conducted on the same day. Details are set out in EDB Circular Memorandum No. 106/2017 issued in June 2017.

Briefing Session

9. To familiarise primary schools more with the arrangements for the Primary 3 TSA in 2018, including the implementation details, selection of assessment reports and relevant information, and related support measures, the HKEAA will conduct a briefing session in the afternoon of **23 March 2018** (**Friday**). For details, please refer to the letter on Primary 3 Territory-wide System Assessment in 2018 issued by the HKEAA to all primary schools today.

Other Recommendations

10. The Committee has also made a number of recommendations, including enhancing the assessment literacy of schools and teachers as well as their abilities to make good use of assessment information, strengthening support for schools,

continuing the development of quality online learning-teaching-assessment resources, exploring greater transparency of students' performance data, encouraging schools to organise parent education activities and fostering the community's understanding of assessment literacy. The EDB will study the recommendations in detail and implement them as soon as possible.

Home-school Cooperation

- 11. Schools should, through regular channels, maintain good communication with parents to familiarise them with school mission and policies and encourage them to approach schools directly should they have any views and suggestions for improvement. To facilitate and assist schools in communicating TSA's objectives and design to parents of Primary 3 students, the EDB has designed two leaflets entitled "Territory-Wide System Assessment" and "Understanding TSA". The leaflets are intended for Primary 3 students and their parents, and schools are advised to distribute them to all Primary 3 students and their parents. The leaflets are available for collection, on producing the enclosed form duly completed by school heads, at the Regional Education Offices of the EDB from 26 March to 20 April 2018. Meanwhile, the electronic versions of the two leaflets have been uploaded to the EDB website².
- 12. The EDB would like to thank schools for their continuous efforts in providing quality education. We will continue to work together with schools in making good use of assessment information to improve learning and teaching, facilitate students' learning and thus help students rise to challenges ahead with positive attitudes and pursue lifelong learning and holistic development.
