1. Entry Requirements

- The Contest is open to secondary students in Hong Kong.
- Each school can submit a maximum of TWO entries.
- Each entry should be submitted on an individual or group basis (with up to 5 members in each group).
- Each student, with a clear specified role, is allowed to participate in ONE entry only.
- All entries should be submitted through the schools of the students.

2. Rules and Regulations

- Each entrant/group should write English lyrics for a song and prepare a singing performance with the song using ONE of the three melodies newly composed by the renowned Hong Kong song-writer Mr NG Cheuk-yin. If a school submits two entries, each entry should be based on a different melody. Complete the Google Reply Form shown in Appendix 2b (https://forms.gle/YGSAhHi8wK4ahiAz7) to obtain audio files and lead sheets of the three melodies.
- For entry submission, the following items, saved in a CD-ROM or flash drive, should be delivered by hand to the designated address:
 - (i) the English lyrics in both WORD and PDF formats, and
 - (ii) a video recording of the singing performance in mp4 format

• Song lyrics:

The song lyrics should:

- > convey a positive message (e.g. Be Grateful and Treasure What We Have, Stay Positive and Optimistic) and promote positive values and attitudes (e.g. perseverance, diligence, empathy, respect and care for others)
- include a quotable line that can highlight the key message of the song and serve as a saying of wisdom (e.g. "Seize every opportunity", "The best is yet to come."), which is underlined in the submission
- display creativity in the use of language and make effective use of any of the following literary devices where appropriate:

• Performance of the song:

- The song can be performed in solo or in group of no more than 5 students, including the singer(s) [e.g. lead singer(s), backup singer(s)] and instrumentalist(s) [e.g. guitarist(s), drummer], where applicable.
- ➤ Participants are free to render the song in any styles (e.g. a cappella) and/or perform it with any instrumental accompaniment they deem appropriate.
- ➤ Choreography and movement would not be assessed though they might enhance the overall performance.
- ➤ The singing performance should be video-recorded for submission.
- ➤ The video recording of the singing performance should be taken in one shot and submitted in their original recording form without any post-recording editing.
- All entries will NOT be returned.
- The EDB reserves the right to modify the rules and regulations of the Contest.

- All entries will be assessed based on the following criteria:
 - a) content and message of the song
 - b) language use in the lyrics
 - c) musicality of the performance including expression, interpretation and ensembleship (applicable for group entry only)
 - d) performance techniques in vocal and instrumental aspects

- e) creativity and originality of the performance
- The decision of the judging panel will be final.
- The Audience Award will be decided by the results of public polling to be conducted in June 2022.
- Schools would be notified of the results by **the end of July 2022**.

Photo and 1-minute Video Competition on Conservation, Culture and Environment of Hong Kong Countryside

Aims / Objectives

This is to invite all primary and secondary schools to participate in the captioned competition organised by the Countryside Conservation Office (CCO) of Environmental Protection Department (EPD) and supported by the Education Bureau.

Details

- 2. The competition aims to cultivate and educate the general public to develop a sense of responsibility towards countryside conservation, and to raise their environmental awareness through unleashing their creativity in photography and video production, showing our precious assets in the countryside where the nature, architectural environment and cultural heritage require our care.
- 3. The competition consists of Photo Section and Video Section, and is divided into Primary School Category, Secondary School Category and Open Category, each with the following awards: "Champion", "First Runner-up", "Second Runner-up", "Public's Best Choice", "School with the Most Participants" and "Honourable Mention". Awardees will be invited to an Award Presentation Ceremony and their entries will be displayed in an Exhibition which will be held in July / August.
- 4. Photograph and video entries must present true objects and reflect countryside scenery. Participants are required to submit a title and a 50-word caption for their creation. The photograph should be no smaller than 1MB and no larger than 5MB. The duration of the video should be no longer than one minute.
- 5. Schools are invited to leverage the competition to promote cross-curricular collaboration, with a view to:
 - enhancing students' awareness of and knowledge in sustainable development of remote countryside areas;
 - encouraging students' creative expression through producing photographs and videos on countryside conservation; and
 - enriching holistic education for students' all-round development.

<u>Story Telling Gurus – Moral / Religious Stories Interpreting Competition</u> cum Online Quiz for Secondary Schools

Objectives

Enhancement of values education is a major focus of our school curriculum. The recently updated *Moral and Civic Education Curriculum Framework* emphasizes the importance of fostering in students the ten priority values, namely "Perseverance", "Respect for Others", "Responsibility", "National Identity", "Commitment", "Integrity", "Care for Others", "Law-abidingness", "Empathy" and "Diligence". With a view to providing a rich learning experience for the students and cultivating their positive values, the Personal, Social and Humanities Education Section of the Curriculum Development Institute will host an event called "Story Telling Gurus – Moral / Religious Stories Interpreting Competition cum Online Quiz for Secondary Schools" (The Competitions). The details are as follows.

Details

2. Eligible participants

The Competitions are open to all secondary school students in Hong Kong. The Junior Secondary Section is for S1-3 students, while the Senior Secondary Section is for S4-6 students.

(A) Stories Interpreting Competition

3. Competition categories and requirements

The product should be developed around the theme of "Perseverance", "Respect for Others", "Responsibility", "National Identity", "Commitment", "Integrity", "Care for Others", "Law-abidingness", "Empathy", "Diligence" or other positive values. Participants are required to create, adapt or interpret one moral / religious story that promotes positive values in one of the following formats.

Category A (Video Clips / Animations / Picture-books)

- o The play time of the product should not be longer than 10 minutes.
- The resolution of the image should at least be 1280x720.
- The product should be saved in a format that is ready for upload to YouTube (such as avi / mov / mpeg4, etc.).

Category B (Audio Tracks)

- o The play time of the product should not be longer than 10 minutes.
- o The bit-rate of the product should at least be 128 Kbps.
- The product should be saved in wav / mp3 format.

Category C (Comics / Cartoons)

- o The product should be of A4 paper size (one page only). There is no restriction on the number of boxes used on that A4 paper size product.
- o The product can be hand-drawn or plotted with the use of computer software.
- Submissions in electronic format should be saved in a PDF/JPEG file. Image density should be at least 600 DPI.

4. Submission deadline

The submission deadline is 3 May 2022. (The receiving time at the designated electronic platform for an electronic submission and the date of the post stamp chop for a hardcopy submission will be used to decide whether a submission meets the deadline. Late submissions will not be entertained.)

5. Judging criteria

Content 40%Skills 30%Creativity 30%

6. The panel of adjudicators are comprised of university scholars, religious leaders and EDB officers.

7. Prizes

The following prizes will be given to EACH of Category A (Video Clips / Animations / Picture-books), Category B (Sound Tracks) and Category C (Comics / Cartoons) in both the Junior Secondary Section and Senior Secondary Section.

- One Champion: HK\$2,000 book coupon, a trophy and a certificate,
- One First-runner-up: HK\$1,500 book coupon, a trophy and a certificate,
- One Second-runner-up: HK\$1,000 book coupon, a trophy and a certificate, and
- o Five Merits: HK\$500 book coupon, a trophy and a certificate.

(B) Online Quiz

 - Students listen to stories and answer 3 questions for each story (8 stories and 24 questions in total). Participants with more than 80% accurate answers will receive an electronic certificate.
 - There are awards for schools with high participation rate.
 - o Deadline of online quiz enrolment is 15 April 2022.
