Resources in Support of Students' Self-directed Learning (II)

(Note: This circular memorandum should be read by heads and teachers of all primary and secondary schools.)

Summary

This circular memorandum aims to inform schools about a variety of additional online resources and related reference materials which enable schools to promote students' self-directed learning during the special vacation.



Details

2. Due to the epidemic situation, schools have a special vacation from March to April 2022. This Bureau issued [Circular Memorandum No.55/2022](#) on 7 March 2022, listing a variety of online teaching resources developed in-house and related reference materials to encourage students to learn during the vacation. Schools can, with due regard to their own contexts and students' learning needs, use these resource materials to enable students to make the most of the special vacation and engage in online self-directed learning at home so that they will be well prepared for the resumption of classes.

3. We have compiled additional resources for teachers to arrange extended learning or self-directed learning activities, which are in line with the curriculum, for students (e.g. theme-based reading, interactive quiz games and animated short videos), covering different Key Learning Areas / subjects / curriculum areas. A list of recommended resources is set out at the Annex. It comprises a selection of our country's online educational resources, including the latest "Tiangong Class" video (<https://bit.ly/358KddQchinadaily>), in which the astronauts demonstrated several scientific experiments under the micro-gravity condition (please refer to p.12 of the Annex for details). A collection of online learning resources, developed by other government departments

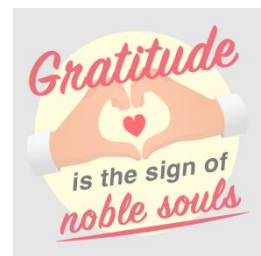

and organisations (including tertiary institutions), that align with our local school curriculum, is also available for students' self-learning.



4. We are grateful to different sectors and institutions in the community for launching various online learning resources and activities for students during the suspension of face-to-face classes and the special vacation, as well as for providing students with more information on making good use of the community learning resources to support continuous learning for the benefit of students.



5. The epidemic has helped us further appreciate life and learn to show our gratitude and appreciation for the people and events around us. Students can express their gratitude and thanks to the health care personnel and the anti-epidemic workers for their selfless efforts by making cards, filming short videos and writing thank you letters.



6. Students will stay at home during the special vacation in view of the epidemic. Apart from encouraging students to consolidate and revise what they have learnt and maintain their motivation in learning, teachers can also remind students to get adequate rest, help out with the household chores, do exercise more often to maintain physical and mental health, and play a part in fighting the epidemic by getting vaccinated as early as possible.
