Further Support for Schools in the Implementation of "My Pledge to Act – Be Grateful and Treasure What We Have, Stay Positive and Optimistic" (2022/23) Related Activities and Resources

Summary

The purpose of this circular memorandum is to inform heads of kindergartens, primary schools and secondary schools (including special schools) of the activity details of the "My Pledge to Act" (MPA) for the 2022/23 school year, as well as the learning and teaching resources and promotional materials for schools.

Background

2. Since 2019, schools have been advised to organise school-based MPA learning activities on the theme "Be Grateful and Treasure What We Have, Stay Positive and Optimistic" within and beyond the classroom to help students develop a sense of gratitude, learn to cherish the things they have, adopt a positive and optimistic attitude towards life, and face challenges and difficulties with courage.

3. The Education Bureau (EDB) issued the <u>EDB Circular</u> <u>Memorandum No. 114/2022</u> to announce the details of the MPA 2022/23 on 21 July 2022 (please scan the QR code on the right to view the content), including the three new sub-themes under the main theme – "Be Grateful and Treasure What We Have, Stay Positive and Optimistic" (i.e. "Be



Diligent and Law-abiding, Perform Acts of Kindness", "Think from Others' Perspectives, Foster Harmony and Be Respectful" and "Inherit Traditional Culture, Be Patriotic and Love Hong Kong"), MPA Ambassador School-based Award Programme, "Happy, Promising Little Sun & Friends" ("樂諾小太陽" & Friends) Mascot Design Competition and the arrangements for the "My Pledge to Act" Funding Programme.

Details

4. To further support schools in the implementation of the MPA, the EDB is going to provide schools with resources and materials related to the MPA Ambassador School-based Award Programme and "Happy, Promising Little Sun & Friends" ("樂諾小太陽" & Friends) Mascot Design Competition, and launch more learning activities, so as to encourage schools' participation in the promotion of values education. Schools may refer to <u>Annex 4</u> for the activity schedule. Details of the activities are as follows:

(a) "My Pledge to Act" Activity Series (1): MPA Ambassador School-based Award Programme [Extension of deadline for resource application]

The EDB has been providing a wide range of materials, including learning and teaching resources, promotional materials, the MPA Handbook and **MPA Mascot** ("樂諾小太 陽") **Badges** and certificates, for schools to implement the MPA Ambassador Schoolbased Award Programme and recognise students' outstanding performance in putting

positive values into action. (Please refer to the <u>EDB Circular</u> <u>Memorandum No.114/2022</u> for details). To encourage more schools to join the programme, the resource application deadline has been extended to 4 November 2022 (Friday). (b) "My Pledge to Act" Activity Series (2): "Happy, Promising Little Sun & Friends" ("樂諾小太陽" & Friends) Mascot Design Competition [Extension of deadline for submission]

Students are invited to design mascots to spread positive messages about <u>one</u> of the MPA sub-themes (i.e. "Be Diligent and Law-abiding, Perform Acts of Kindness", "Think from Others' Perspectives, Foster Harmony and Be Respectful" or "Inherit Traditional Culture, Be Patriotic and Love Hong Kong"). Entrants are required to submit entries through their schools to the designated website. Please refer to the <u>EDB</u> <u>Circular Memorandum No.114/2022</u> for details of the competition. The deadline for submission has been extended to 30 December 2022 (Friday) so as to encourage more

students to take part in the competition and allow them more time to understand the deeper meaning of the three sub-themes of the MPA and form creative ideas.

(c) "My Pledge to Act" Activity Series (3): "Let's Project Positive Energy" Social Platform Creative Post Design Competition

The EDB will organise the "'Let's Project Positive Energy' Social Platform Creative Post Design Competition" to unleash students' creativity through composing images and short texts to promote the positive messages of "Be Grateful and Treasure What We Have, Stay Positive and Optimistic", "Be Diligent and Law-abiding, Perform Acts of Kindness", "Think from Others' Perspectives, Foster Harmony and Be Respectful" or "Inherit Traditional Culture, Be Patriotic and Love Hong Kong" and share their personal experiences, with a view to injecting positive energy into society. Please refer to <u>Annex 2</u> for details of the competition

(d) "My Pledge to Act" Activity Series (4): "Be Grateful and Treasure What We Have, Stay Positive and Optimistic" Parent-child Storytelling Competition (Kindergarten)

Effective nurturing of positive values in students should start from early age, and parental involvement is indispensable. The EDB will organise **"Be Grateful and Treasure What We Have, Stay Positive and Optimistic" Parent-child Storytelling Competition (Kindergarten)**, which aims to promote home-school cooperation, deepen children's understanding of positive values such as "Be Grateful", "Treasure What We Have", "Stay Positive" and "Stay Optimistic", and enhance parent-child relationship through creating/selecting and act out a short daily life story related to the a chosen theme. 

"My Pledge to Act" Activity Series (3): "Let's Project Positive Energy" Social Platform Creative Post Design Competition

Objective:

This competition aims to enhance primary and secondary students' understanding of and reflection on the MPA theme and sub-themes – "Be Grateful and Treasure What We Have, Stay Positive and Optimistic", "Be Diligent and Law-abiding, Perform Acts of Kindness", "Think from Others' Perspectives, Foster Harmony and Be Respectful" or "Inherit Traditional Culture, Be Patriotic and Love Hong Kong", and help them think of ways to put them into practice in daily life. It also aims to bring positive energy to society through the composition of theme-echoing images and short texts that incorporate relevant positive messages and students' personal experiences.

Targets and Participation:

- The Primary and Secondary Sections of the competition are open to all primary and secondary students respectively.
- Students should enter the competition as individual entrants. Each entrant should submit only one entry, otherwise he/she will be disqualified.
- Each school can submit a maximum of ten entries for each Section.

Themes and Entry Requirements:

- Entrants are required to compose a social platform post that promotes positive values related to <u>one of the MPA sub-themes</u> (i.e. "Be Diligent and Law-abiding, Perform Acts of Kindness", "Think from Others' Perspectives, Foster Harmony and Be Respectful" or "Inherit Traditional Culture, Be Patriotic and Love Hong Kong").
- The post should consist of two components:
 - Text: A short text within 250 words (including punctuation). The text can be written in Chinese or English. Other languages will not be accepted.
 - Image: One image in the form of photo or hand-drawn/computer-aided illustration.

Submission of Entries:

- Entrants are required to upload their entries to a designated website through their attending schools (please scan the QR code on the right). The submission should include:



 the completed Entry Form (one for each participating school – the "Entry Form" must be in PDF format with the school name as the file name, e.g. "Entry Form_XX School".);

- 2. school name, principal's name, and the name, email address and contact number of the teacher-in-charge;
- 3. the names and classes of entrants (a maximum of ten entrants); and
- 4. the text and image of each entry (a maximum of ten entries).
- There are no limitations on the drawing tools of the hand-drawn entries. The entries must be drawn on drawing paper and scanned by the schools. The scanned hand-drawn entries, photos or computer-aided design entries should be in JPEG format with a size of 1200 x 1200 pixels, with resolution not less than 150dpi.
- The file name should be in a specific format (School Name_Class_Entrant_ Name, e.g. "Hong Kong School_6B_Chan Tai Man").
- Submission by other means, such as CD-ROMs by post, by e-mail and physical items inperson, will not be accepted.
- The deadline for submission of entries is 24 February 2023 (Friday). The entry submission time will be based on the date and time indicated in the EDB's server system. Late submissions will not be accepted.

- Awardees will be invited to attend the Values Education Annual Prize Presentation Ceremony and receive the prizes.

Objective:

Through engaging parents and their children in creating/selecting and acting out a short daily life story that echoes the theme "Be Grateful and Treasure What We Have, Stay Positive and Optimistic", children's positive values and attitudes can be nurtured. Home-school cooperation and parent-child relationship can also be enhanced.

Targets and Participation:

- The competition is open to students and parents of all kindergartens and kindergarten-cumchild care centres in Hong Kong.
- Students should enter the competition as individual entrants. Each participant should submit only one entry through his/her attending school; otherwise he/she will be disqualified.
- Each school can submit a maximum of ten entries for each Section.

Themes and Entry Requirements:

- Drawing inspirations from the people and happenings around them, the entrants (together with their parents) should create/select and perform a short story echoing the theme "Be Grateful and Treasure What We Have, Stay Positive and Optimistic", so as to convey related values and promote a positive attitude towards life.

•	The video must be recorded live without any dubbing, sound editing and background music. The image and audio of the video must be clear. The video quality will affect the marks awarded.
•	The video could be in landscape or portrait layout. When shooting, keep the lens steady and avoid moving and shaking.
•	To enhance interest and appeal, the entrant may use appropriate props and body movements as aids, and may wear proper school uniform or clothes that match with the story during the filming.
