Summary

The purpose of this circular memorandum is to invite kindergartens, primary and secondary schools to participate in the coming educational activities and events organised, co-organised or announced by Curriculum Development Institute, Education Bureau (EDB). When arranging learning activities and relevant learning and teaching resources for students (including printed and electronic library collections and other reading and curriculum materials for students), schools should ensure that the activities are in line with the learning goals and curriculum objectives, the learning needs of students are catered for, and the safety of students and teachers are taken into account. Please refer to the relevant circulars and guidelines issued by the EDB for the points to note in arranging activities. In addition, the content and quality of the learning and teaching resources of individual Key Learning Areas (KLAs) and cross-curricular subjects in the school should be regularly reviewed in order to ensure that the content and information contained in learning and teaching resources are accurate, complete, objective and impartial, and emphasise the development of proper values, positive attitudes, and appropriate behaviours among students.

Key dates in September and October include "Victory Day of Chinese People's War of Resistance against Japanese Aggression" on 3 September, "September 18 Incident Memorial Day" on 18 September, "Chinese Mid-Autumn Festival" on 29 September, "Martyrs' Day" on 30 September, and "National Day" on 1 October.

6. In order to plan and promote national education in a holistic and systematic manner, schools should arrange teaching of related subjects and appropriate school-based national education learning activities outside the classroom, such as arranging the raising of the national flag, and the playing and singing of the national anthem, organising thematic book exhibitions in the school library, engaging students in sharing film review on patriotic films, organising festive activities and engaging students in collecting information on the recent development of our country, by adopting the approaches of "organic integration", "natural connection", "diversified strategies", "mutual coordination", "learning within and beyond the classroom", and "whole-school participation". The learning activities should deepen students' understanding of the major historical events and figures of our country, the Chinese culture and enable them to grasp accurately the constitutional order established by the principle of "One Country, Two Systems", the Constitution and the Basic Law as well as the significance of national security, etc.



 - ✓ Students sign up voluntarily, then the Teacher Advisor selects and appoints those who are passionate about environmental protection

- ✓ Each class teacher nominates not more than two GPs for his/her class or assigns existing monitors/prefects to undertake the duties
- ✓ Assign not more than two Head GPs in each participating school, who are usually from senior levels and directly responsible to the Teacher Advisor
- ✓ GPs of senior levels pair up with those of junior levels to assist the latter in performing their duties
- 2.3 <u>GP Handbook and Badge</u>
 - Each participating school will be provided with a soft copy of the GP Programme Handbook (online version at <u>https://school.ecc.org.hk/en/resources/forms.html#gpp</u>) for distribution to GPs for performing their duties. The handbook contains not only environmental checklists and best practices in various environmental aspects for GPs



to carry out their monitoring duties on campus on a monthly basis, but also provides environmental tips and activity suggestions on promoting environmental protection to broaden students' environmental knowledge.

• A Big Waster (大嘥鬼) badge will be distributed to each GP to recognise their role. To ensure the proper use of resources, re-appointed GPs shall continue to use their existing Big Waster badges. The ECC will only issue new Big Waster badges to students who are selected as GPs for the first time, or those who need a replacement badge due to damage or loss.

Hong Kong Police Force Leadership Institute on Narcotics (L.I.O.N.) (2023/24 School Year)

Aims / Objectives

This is to invite all secondary schools to participate in the captioned programme.

Details

2. The Hong Kong Police Force will roll out the third cohort of "Leadership Institute on Narcotics (L.I.O.N.)" in the 2023/24 school year. The programme was established since 2021, with a view to training students as anti-drug leaders for promoting anti-drug messages in schools and society, so as to enhance teenagers and the general public's understanding drug problems and to encourage them to stay away from drugs. A total of 80 Form Four students from 20 secondary schools and 20 university students will be selected as mentees to take part in a one-year training programme given by advisors from different professions on anti-drug knowledge, leadership skills, event planning and others. Mentees also have the opportunities to practice what they learnt by designing and executing anti-drug publicity campaign in their own secondary schools and society for publicising anti-drug messages. Through the abovementioned activities, L.I.O.N. aims to :

- (1) extend mentees' anti-drug knowledge through various training and learning experience;
- (2) develop mentees' leadership skills;
- (3) provide mentees with international and Mainland exchange opportunities to broaden their horizons; and
- (4) create opportunities for mentees to implement their own anti-drug activities on campuses and spread anti-drug messages to society and among peers.

Programme Highlights

3. Each secondary school will form a team and nominate four Form Four students as L.I.O.N. mentees. Each team will be assigned a university student and a professional as mentors to guide mentees in designing and executing the anti-drug campaigns. Mentees will receive a series of professional training, including anti-drug and legal knowledge, leadership skills, communication technique and team management skills conducted by university professors, scientists, human resources executive trainers, etc. Mentees will also go on Mainland field trips to learn about the national anti-drug strategies, visit high-tech industries and exchange views with local students. Outstanding mentees will also be awarded overseas exchange opportunities and scholarships.

Recruitment Details

4. The application period will commence in September 2023 and selection interviews will be conducted in November. Selected mentees will receive training between January and August 2024 and launch their anti-drug campaign between September and November 2024. 
Details

2. The programme is co-organised by the Consumer Council and the Education Bureau (EDB), with the support of around 30 participating and supporting organisations.

3. The programme will be implemented in the 2023/24 school year and conducted in two phases. The first phase, taking place from 2023/24 to 2024/25 school years, will comprise three competitions: "My Unique Project Study", "My Witty Online Quiz", and "My Fun IG Post Creation". An ambassador programme "My Best Ambassador Scheme" will be introduced in the second phase (2025/26 school year and onward) and winners of the past competitions will be recruited as ambassadors to assist in promoting consumer education.

4. The activities of SCA cover three major themes, namely rational consumption, sustainable consumption and green lifestyle, and consumption and caring for the community. These activities can also integrate flexibly into secondary school curricula, including Citizenship, Economics and Society, Values Education and Technology Education. Students can participate in one, two or all three competitions according to their own interests or specialities. The Consumer Council will provide free and timely support to students during the competitions to enhance students' thinking skills and their learning as well as help them complete the competitions.

1st Smart Consumption Academy Introduction

Target:Secondary School Students(Junior Forms: S1 - S3)(Senior Forms: S4 - S6)

Activity 1: "My Unique Project Study"

The activity aims to inspire secondary school students to conduct in-depth studies and reflections on topics such as the latest consumption trends, consumer behaviours and product comparisons, thereby enhancing their learning of consumption topics covered by various curricula/learning areas in the secondary school curriculum, and cultivating in them positive consumption attitudes, ultimately and effectively developing values education and STEAM education. Participating students need to form teams and submit a 2-page project plan. 50 teams will then be shortlisted to conduct their project studies and prepare full reports in the form of text, Powerpoint presentation or media production. Supporting activities including talks, visits and workshops will be organised by the Consumer Council during the process so as to help students complete the competition.

Activity 2: "My Witty Online Quiz"

The Online Quiz Contest aims to enhance secondary school students' understanding of the Consumer Council's missions and work in promoting and protecting consumers' rights, and equip them with the relevant knowledge to make sensible consumer decisions and embrace sustainable consumption behaviours, as well as strengthen their sense of personal and social responsibility. In the first round of online quiz, materials for students' pre-study will be uploaded onto the designated contest website and students then answer a set of multiple-choice questions within specific time limits. Each of the 3 schools with the highest accumulated scores forms a team and enters the live final competition.





Activity 3: "My Fun IG Post Creation"

The activity aims to encourage secondary school students to share their observations, thoughts and experiences on their own or others' consumption behaviour in the form of a post on Instagram (IG), one of the most popular social media platforms among the young, thereby enhancing their powers of observation, creativity and cultivating in them positive consumption values. Participants design an IG post with one photo/graphic design/video (less than 1 minute) and a related short description (less than 100 words) and submit it to the designated IG account inbox or send the photo/graphic design/video and the short description to designated email account.



Activity 4: "My Best Ambassador Scheme"

Agriculture, Fisheries and Conservation Department Respect, Care for and Appreciate Marine Wildlife Campaign 2023/24

Summary

The purpose of this annex is to inform primary schools and secondary schools of the "Respect, Care for and Appreciate Marine Wildlife Campaign" by the Agriculture, Fisheries and Conservation Department (AFCD) for the 2023/24 school year, through organising a series of education and publicity activities in enhancing students' understanding of Hong Kong's marine environment and wildlife, and raise their awareness of the need to respect, care for and appreciate our marine resources.

Background

2. Surrounded by about 1650 km² of marine waters, Hong Kong has a rich diversity of marine habitats and wildlife. To respect and care for these precious marine resources, AFCD is committed to educate the public, especially our primary and secondary students on marine conservation. In 2023/24 school year, activities including school talks, guided eco-tours, field trips and exhibition panel borrowing service will be provided for students and teachers to promote their awareness in "**Respect, Care for and Appreciate our Marine Wildlife**". By organising various activities from October 2023 to June 2024, AFCD looks forward to collaborate with schools and teachers to instill into students a sense of responsibility to protect and preserve the marine ecosystems while appreciating the vibrant and diverse marine wildlife.

Details

3. The marine wildlife of Hong Kong is exceedingly diverse. There are more than 1,000 marine fish species within Hong Kong waters, representing about 30% of marine fish diversity of the South China Sea. Gobies, wrasses, groupers, jacks and snappers are some of the most species-rich marine fish families. Marine invertebrates are also abundant, ranging from corals, mollusca to crustaceans. There are 84 species of **hard corals** and 2 species of **horseshoe crabs** in Hong Kong. The richest coral communities prevail to the east and northeast of Hong Kong where the waters are both sheltered and free from the influence of

Pearl River. Juvenile horseshoe crabs are found on some sandy beaches or mudflats in Deep Bay and Lantau Island. Chinese White Dolphins and Finless Porpoises are resident **marine mammal** species and can be found year-round. Marine mammals, horseshoe crabs and hard corals have been selected as the three marine wildlife groups for promoting the present campaign.
