Summary

The purpose of this circular memorandum is to invite kindergartens, primary and secondary schools to participate in the coming educational activities and events organised, co-organised or announced by Curriculum Development Institute, Education Bureau (EDB). When arranging learning activities and relevant learning and teaching resources for students (including printed and electronic library collections and other reading and curriculum materials for students), schools should ensure that the activities are in line with the learning goals and curriculum objectives, the learning needs of students are catered for, and the safety of students and teachers are taken into account. Please refer to the relevant circulars and guidelines issued by the EDB for the points to note in arranging activities. In addition, the content and quality of the learning and teaching resources of individual Key Learning Areas (KLAs) and cross-curricular subjects in the school should be regularly reviewed in order to ensure that the content and information contained in learning and teaching resources are accurate, complete, objective and impartial, and emphasise the development of proper values, positive attitudes, and appropriate behaviours among students.

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preceding/following school days; and arranging for students to read literary pieces about the Ching Ming Festival to enable them to understand the meaning of "paying careful attention to the funeral rites of parents and showing reverence for ancestors", by adopting the approaches of "organic integration", "natural connection", "diversified strategies", "mutual co-ordination", "learning within and beyond the classroom", and "whole-school participation". Schools may also encourage students with the proverb "A year's plan lies in spring, a life's plan lies in diligence" during the spring in April.

Visual Arts Gifted Education Programme: Beijing Visual Arts Study Tour

Aims / Objectives

This circular memorandum introduces the captioned study tour to secondary schools.

Details

2. The Visual Arts Gifted Education Programme (the Programme) is co-organised by the Arts Education (AE) Section, Curriculum Development Institute (CDI) of the Education Bureau (EDB) and the Hong Kong Academy for Gifted Education (HKAGE). The Programme provides Level 3 off-school professional training for gifted education in secondary schools. It aims to enhance the development of art knowledge and skills of gifted students with potential in visual arts and nurture their talents for the development of Hong Kong's arts and cultural industries.

3. The Programme will include the captioned study tour, which aims to strengthen students' observation, thinking and drawing skills, as well as cultivate their appreciation of Chinese culture and national identity. They will be achieved through attending the fine-drawing course taught by professional instructors of the Central Academy of Fine Arts in Beijing (北京中央美術學院) and visiting the Palace Museum and the National Museum of China.

4. Students currently studying in secondary 2 to secondary 5, who are Grand Prize or Gold Prize winners in the Exhibition of Student Visual Arts Work, or outstanding student members in the visual arts domain of the HKAGE, will be invited to attend selection interviews. Students selected by professionals will participate in the study tour and the pre-tour activities. Detailed schedule is as follows:

Aims / Objectives

This is to invite primary and secondary schools to participate in the captioned activity.

Details

2. To tie in with the '4.23 – Hong Kong Reading for All Day', the Hong Kong Public Libraries (HKPL), in collaboration with different stakeholders, will organise an array of large-scale territory-wide reading activities during the 'Hong Kong Reading Week 2025' from 19 to 27 April 2025 in both online and onsite modes. The event will further promote the benefits of reading citywide, promote quality reading materials, encourage citizens to cultivate a reading habit and create a reading atmosphere in the city.

3. Under the theme of 'Zoom/LIBRARY', the 'Hong Kong Reading Week 2025' features a series of Fun Days to be organised at designated public libraries on 26 and 27 April 2025. Outreach programmes including a tram tour – 'REadCONNECT family activities' and 'Library-on-Wheels Carnival', online activities such as reading clubs, and videos of author sharing session on nature conservation, as well as short films of popular KOL on library facilities and services, will be organised to allow the public to share the fun of reading.

4. 'Read Together for Half an Hour' will be held on 23 April 2025. Citizens may have 30-Minute Read at different reading locations, including Hong Kong Public Libraries, LCSD venues, and NGOs, etc. to cultivate their reading habits and create an atmosphere for reading together. Teachers are



recommended to encourage students to participate. For details, please visit the event webpage (www.hkpl.gov.hk/hkrw).

5. In addition, to echo the 'Hong Kong Reading for All Day', the Hong Kong Publishing Federation (HKPF) funded by the Cultural and Creative Industries Development Agency (CCIDA) under the Culture, Sports & Tourism Bureau, will organise the '2025 HK Reading +' reading activity at Entrance Arena (Level 1) and Atrium (Level 3) of New Town Plaza from 18 to 27 April 2025. To promote the benefits of reading and foster a reading atmosphere among the public, 'The Beauty of Books' exhibition, author sharing sessions and music performances, etc. will be organised over the course of ten days.
