"My Pledge to Act" -

Be Grateful and Treasure What We Have, Stay Positive and Optimistic (2025/26)

Summary

This circular memorandum is to inform all kindergartens, primary schools and secondary schools (including special schools) of the arrangements for the "My Pledge to Act" (MPA) for the 2025/26 school year, the learning and teaching (L&T) resources and promotional materials provided to schools, as well as to announce a series of MPA activities for early information.

Background

2. Since 2003, the Education Bureau (EDB) has been organising the Values Education Promotional Campaign: "My Pledge to Act" (MPA), enabling all schools in Hong Kong to nurture in students virtues and a healthy lifestyle through collective commitment and learning activities related to values education. In the 2025/26 school year, the EDB will continue to promote the MPA. This circular provides an overview of a series of student activities organised for kindergartens, primary schools and secondary schools, enabling schools to plan ahead for encouraging student participation, thereby promoting the proper values and attitudes among students. Additionally, the EDB will continue to provide diversified L&T resources and promotional materials to support schools in organising related activities.



Details

3. In the 2025/26 school year, the MPA will continue to adopt the theme of "Gratitude and Cherish, Positivity and Optimism", fostering students' development of a sense of gratitude, helping them learn to cherish what they have, adopt a positive and optimistic attitude towards

life, and face transitions and challenges in life and growth. With reference to the theme and four sub-themes of the MPA, schools may set, and incorporate into the school annual plan or school development plan, their annual major concerns or development goals in alignment with the schools' goals, vision and missions, religious backgrounds, characteristics, contexts and students' learning needs, with a view to promoting values education both within and beyond the classroom by adopting the approaches of holistic planning and whole-school participation.

4. To support schools in implementing the MPA, the EDB will launch a series of learning and promotional activities, L&T resources, and promotional materials in the 2025/26 school year. Schools may organise the following major activities at the beginning of the 2025/26 school year:

(a) "My Pledge to Act" Activity Series (1): MPA Ambassador School-based Award Programme

Schools may organise school-based MPA Ambassador Award Programme by tapping the L&T resources, promotional materials and the MPA Handbook provided by the EDB, with a view to recognising and appointing students with good character who consistently "MPA demonstrate positive behaviour Ambassadors". Schools may engage the MPA Ambassadors in planning, promoting, and implementing school-based values education activities. Schools may also honour the ambassadors with active participation



and outstanding performance by awarding them the MPA Mascot ("樂諾小太陽") Badges and certificates.

To promote the implementation of the "MPA Ambassador School-based Award Programme", the EDB will **organise a variety of collective activities** for "MPA Ambassadors" of primary and secondary schools in the 2025/26 school year. These activities may include visits to non-profit animal protection organisations, government departments, greening

facilities and etc., as well as inviting them, on a priority basis, to participate in the values education movie appreciation and interactive theatre organised by the EDB.

Details of the activities will be announced in due course in the 2025/26 school

year for schools' enrolment. The L&T resources, promotional materials and certificates for the "MPA Ambassador School-based Award Programme" have been uploaded to the MPA Theme-based Resources Webpage (please scan the



QR code on the right) for schools to adapt and deploy flexibly.

Schools requesting the MPA Mascot Badges ("樂諾小太陽襟章") (100 pieces per school) for the 2025/26 school year should complete the Reply Slip attached (please refer to Annex 2), and fax it to Moral, Civic and National Education Section 1 (fax number: 3426 9265) on or before 17 October 2025 (Friday) for arrangements.

(b) "My Pledge to Act" Activity Series (2): Territory-wide "Let's Pledge Together" Ceremony

The EDB recommends all kindergartens, primary, and secondary schools in Hong Kong to organise the "Let's Pledge Together" Ceremony from September to November, so as to help

students set goals and put them into action, with a view to nurturing them into good citizens who keep their promises, and are committed as well as willing to take proper action through the school-based pledging activities. During the ceremony, schools can lead students to sing the values education theme song "Building Our Dream" to inspire them to embark on their dreams and turn proper values into good deeds. The EDB will issue a Certificate of Participation - "My Pledge to Act - Territory-wide Let's Pledge Together" Ceremony and provide

100 small gifts¹ for each participating school for awarding students who perform well in the MPA activities.

Schools may flexibly adapt and deploy the "Let's Pledge Together"

Ceremony Resource Kit (uploaded on the MPA Theme-based Resources Webpage) provided by the EDB according to their specific needs in tandem with other school-based values education learning activities, so as to enhance students' understanding, recognition, and practice of proper values. The Resource Kit includes:

- Suggested activity flow
- Emcee Script
- Principal's speech (versions are available for kindergarten and primary & secondary schools respectively)
- Script of the "Students' Pledge"
- MPA Handbook



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- 5. Additionally, the EDB will organise the following student competitions in the 2025/26 school year, with further details to be announced in the MPA EDBCM in September 2025. Schools may refer to **Appendix 1** for the schedule, and integrate the competitions with classroom learning or school-based activities to encourage student participation.
 - (a) "My Pledge to Act" Activity Series (3): Adventures of the Little Sun Parent-child Story Creation and Performance Competition (Kindergarten)

Submission deadline: 13 February 2026 (Friday)

This activity is designed for kindergartens, inviting parents to collaborate with their children in creating and performing the stories related to the theme of the MPA, with an aim to engage parents in values education for nurturing their children's proper values and attitudes from an early age, as well as enhancing the parent-child relationship.

(b) "My Pledge to Act" Activity Series (4): Discovering Proper Values in Games - Schoolbased Values Education Booth Game Design Competition (Primary School)

Submission deadline: 12 December 2025 (Friday)

This activity is designed for primary schools, encouraging primary school students to actively participate in planning and promoting values education through designing booth games for disseminating positive messages related to the theme and sub-themes of the MPA on the school campus.

(c) "My Pledge to Act" Activity Series (5): City Stroll, City Vlog - Community Tour Video Production Competition (Secondary School)

Submission deadline: 9 January 2026 (Friday)

This activity is designed for secondary schools, encouraging secondary students to unleash their creativity for planning community tour routes and creating videos (vlogs), with a view to motivating them to actively discover the "who", "what", "where", and "how" in their community of the school that are worth appreciating and cherishing. In this competition, students introduce the unique characteristics of the community while promoting the proper values and attitude of "Be Grateful and Treasure What We Have, Stay Positive and Optimistic" to society.

- 6. The EDB will continue to provide the latest updates on the MPA, activity information, L&T resources and promotional materials (e.g. electronic posters, photo props, electronic banners) on the "My Pledge to Act" Theme-based Resources Webpage for downloading or loan by schools.
- 7. Since the 2019/20 school year, the EDB has been implementing the "My Pledge to Act" (MPA) Funding Programme through the Quality Education Fund (QEF). Publicly-funded schools² and kindergartens joining the Kindergarten Education Scheme may, during each round of application, submit one application for funding not exceeding \$200,000 for conducting learning activities aligning with the theme in each respective school year to promote values education. Applications under the MPA Funding Programme are now accepted throughout the year until the 2025/26 school year (Application deadline: 31 August 2026). Schools

could, in accordance with their school contexts, flexibly deploy the unused application quotas to apply for funding in a timely manner to implement diversified learning activities that align with the main theme "Be Grateful and Treasure What We Have, Stay Positive and Optimistic" and support the aforesaid sub-themes to create a



learning environment conducive to cultivating proper values and attitudes. For details of the MPA Funding Programme, please refer to the QEF website (www.qef.org.hk).

8. To gain a better understanding of the implementation of the MPA, school-based "Let's Pledge Together" Ceremony and values education in schools, the EDB will issue a questionnaire to schools in September 2025. Schools are appealed to participate actively in our programmes and promote values education continuously.

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² Publicly-funded schools include government schools, aided schools (including special schools), caput schools, and schools under the Direct Subsidy Scheme.
